What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium Grant, which was introduced by the government in 2011, is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most.

At Trumpington Park Primary School, we receive funding based on the numbers of children who are currently in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM) or have been in receipt of FSM at any point in the past six years (Ever6 FSM). We also receive funding for any children who are currently looked after by a local authority or have been adopted from care.

Total number of pupils on roll	32 (September 2017) rising to 48 in July 2018
Total number of pupils eligible for PPG	5 (not from September 2017– some started later in the year)
Total amount of PPG received	£3900 (based on census data)

Objectives in Spending PPG
To raise achievement and attainment of pupil to Age Related Expectations: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Personalised learning opportunities • Intervention in reading, writing and maths • Provision for social and emotional needs • Securing transition from pre-school and into Year 1 • Raising the impact of experiences throughout the curriculum

Overall outcomes of PPG Spending 2017-18
<p><u>Outcomes for the four PPG pupils at the end of EYFS 2018:</u> 75% children achieved GLD at the end of EYFS. 75% children achieved reading at the end of EYFS. 75% children achieved writing at the end of EYFS. 75% children achieved maths at the end of EYFS.</p> <p><u>Outcomes for the one PPG pupil at the end of Year 1 2018:</u> All pupils achieved the phonic screening at the end of Year 1. All pupils achieved age related expectations in reading. All pupils achieved age related expectations in writing. Age related expectations in maths was not achieved.</p> <p><i>We see these as very positive results for the PP children in the school, good progress was made from the starting points.</i></p>

In class Maths and English support from trained teaching assistants.	£3000	Secure attainment in reading, writing and maths for PP children – at least 75% of all PP children across EYFS to be at age related expectations by the end of the year.
Funding for Reading Interventions	£1200	To increase the proportion of PPG children who make rapid progress so that they achieve at least in line with other pupils nationally. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Interventions to be planned on a termly basis to target reading (using BRP, CAMBUGS, 1:1 reading, comprehension groups)• Provision maps to record entry data and exit data for groups of children• Higher achieving PP readers to be targeted to achieve GD at end of year
Funding for Play Therapy – Blue Smile	£700	To enable children to articulate their emotions and to be supported to deal with their mental wellbeing. Ensuring children are in a good place for learning.
